


The walk passes a Roman fort near the lane to Silverton.



Best Dartington Walks




Walk 1 Dartington Hall & Deer Park (3.4 miles)












Best Emsworthy Mire Walks



Walk 1 Emsworthy Mire (1 mile)




A short and pleasant rural walk from Saddle Tor Car Park South around the Nature Reserve. If you enjoy carpets of blue bells this is a must-do walk!

Best Killerton Walks




Walk 1 Dolbury Hillfort, a Missing Mansion & Columbjohn (2.8 miles)

Killerton is a historic 18th-century estate featuring a Georgian mansion, beautiful gardens, and woodlands, now managed by the National Trust.






A must do walk to the enjoy this magnificent estate - Membership is not required.



More Details & Walks


A popular woodland walk entering part of the Wetlands, a conservation area .


