



An easy and pleasant rural walk to Sowton Village passing Bishop's Court, dating back to the Middle Ages, with its now lost deer park.

A main Roman Road from Exeter to Axminster used to go through this village. The start of the walk runs through the 1549 Prayer Book Rebellion battlefield.




Dartmouth with its narrow streets and ye olde buildings offers the walker many places of interest including the Boat Float and Castle.




More Details & Walks

Exeter's Roman wall dates back to the 2nd century AD - see part of map of Roman Devon below.




More Details & Walks

This pleasant walk starts in Feniton and follows the Old Route of the LSWR Branch Line, along the Otter.

The walk takes you through part of Escot Park designed by Capability Brown in the 18th century. He introduced a new style of landscape with serpentine lakes and clumps of trees standing in vivid contrast against smooth undulating grass running straight to the house.






## Walk 1 Dartmoor & Lydford Castle (6.1 miles)


A delightfully varied walk, not too strenuous, around Lydford with spectacular views of Dartmoor.

## Walk 1 Pinhoe to Pinhoe Church (1.5 miles)




More Details & Walks

This walk takes you along the Pin Brook, past the old Brick Factory, along what used to be a quarry, climbing steadily to Pinhoe Church - 14/15th Century.

Pinhoe, a village on the Pin Brook or a settlement on the hill (hoe), offers the walker many stunning views of the estuary, East Hill near Ottery St Mary or the Blackdown Hills beyond Cullompton and Honiton.

## Walk 3 Town trail (1.4 miles)
